"Sandcastles and the meaning of life" ". . . life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." . . . from Luke 12:13 - 21

Rabbi Harold Kushner writes in his book, **When All You Ever Wanted Isn't Enough**, "I was sitting on a beach one summer day watching two children, a boy and a girl, playing in the sand. They were hard at work building an elaborate and large sandcastle by the ocean's edge, with gates and towers and moats and internal passages. Just when they had nearly finished the project a big wave came along and knocked it down, reducing it to a heap of wet sand. I expected the children to burst into tears, devastated by what had happened to all their hard work. But they surprised me. Instead, they ran up the shore away from the water laughing and holding hands and sat down to build another castle.

"I realized that they had taught me an important lesson. All the things in our lives, all the complicated structures we spend so much time and energy creating, are built on sand. Only our relationships to other people endure. Sooner or later, the wave will come along and knock down what we have worked too hard to build up. When that happens, only the person who has somebody's hand to hold will be able to laugh."

I hope that as you enjoy the remainder of your summer, you will reflect on the importance of our relationships, and the "sandcastles" that are our possessions.

The gift is in honor of the society's 200th anniversary, and to celebrate the church's 250th anniversary. The new pulpit will replace the current dais which was donated by the Organ Society 115 years ago. The new oak pulpit with classic raised panels was designed and built by Henry Miller, a furniture-maker of the Amish community in Jefferson, Maine. The Organ Society ladies worked with Mr. Miller on the design of the pulpit and the special features of the pulpit which include a shelf, a fold-out step to accommodate the shorter readers in the congregation and an additional panel for taller readers.

The Organ Society expresses its thanks to Mr. Miller for his craftsmanship in creating the pulpit and to the anonymous donor who made this gift possible.

Worship in August 2023

A note about forthcoming worship.

The Diaconate decided that Communion in July and August will be served by intinction. People come forward and receive the elements from members of the diaconate.

Worship Themes and Sermons for August

August 6: (Communion): **Sermon: "What Is Love For?"** based on John 6:24 –35. Perhaps the best answer I can give is that love is for nothing! Better come and find out what I mean (and the sermon has in it one of your favorite stories)!

August 13: **Sermon: "Watch Your Language!"** based on Proverbs 12:18 – 19; James 1:17 – 22; Galatians 3:28 – 28; Matthew 36 – 37. We can all remember from our childhood the saying, "sticks and stone may break my bones, but words can never hurt me." How untrue! I have been more deeply hurt by words intentionally or carelessly said, than any physical pain, and I suspect most of you have as well. Let's see what scripture teaches us.

August 20: Sermon: "A Stance for Forgiveness" based on John 7:53 – 8:1. Perhaps one of the toughest lessons that we have to learn and re-learn is this forgiveness and grace business. I have found that in our society it is so easy to take a stance of being right instead of a stance of love. When we need to be right and that makes it awfully difficult to forgive and be gracious.

August 27: Sermon: "A Time to Laugh" based on Proverbs 17:22; I Corinthians 1:18 – 25 and Matthew 7: 1–5 and 23: 25–26. In today's Scripture we read from Paul ". . . it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to those who save those who believe." Today I reveal my folly.

September 3: The Sacrament of Communion

September 10: The 250th Anniversary Service featuring former ministers and special guests.

CLYNK Reminder

CLYNK bags, in which you put your returnable bottles and cans, are available in the church office. The tags that must be put on these bags are in Fellowship Hall tacked on the CIS bulletin board near the kitchen; there are also pre-tagged bags there. Take the tagged filled bags (no more than 20



pounds) to any local Hannaford CLYNK station, or bring it to church and notify Beth Maxwell who will take the bag to Hannaford. There is a bag in the kitchen if you want to bring in bottles and cans and deposit them there instead of collecting them at home. The money collected by using these bags is used to support the Feed Our Scholars program.
